**Prepare the Way for the Lord**  
***The Annunciation: "God Has Heard Your Prayers***  
**Malachi 3:1a & Luke 1:5-17**

***"I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me."*** Malachi 3:1a

**1. Advent**

- a. Advent is a Christian season of \_\_\_\_\_.
  - i. Today, most Christian churches see Advent as preparation for celebrating the first coming of Jesus.
    - ⇒ The candles most often represent \_\_\_\_\_, peace, love, and joy.
    - ⇒ The medieval church (500 AD-1500 AD) saw it as preparation for Christ's second coming—to engage in fasting and penitence in anticipation that the one who came in the manger would be coming again in glory to \_\_\_\_\_ the living and the dead.
    - ⇒ The candles most often represented \_\_\_\_\_, judgement, heaven, and hell.
- b. The season of Advent in the Christian calendar anticipates the *"coming of Christ"* from three perspectives:
  - i. The \_\_\_\_\_ birth of Jesus in Bethlehem—The First Coming of Christ.
  - ii. The reception of Christ in the \_\_\_\_\_ of the believer.
  - iii. The \_\_\_\_\_ Coming of Christ.
- c. *Adventus* (ad'ven.tus): (*Latin*) meaning coming, \_\_\_\_\_ of a king or emperor
  - ⇒ A \_\_\_\_\_ was sent ahead to prepare the way for their arrival.
  - ⇒ The early Christians recognized that John the Baptist fulfilled this role for \_\_\_\_\_.
- d. Because he came to prepare the way for the Lord, John the Baptist is a \_\_\_\_\_ figure for us to explore during Advent.
- e. John the Baptist is mentioned in all \_\_\_\_\_ of the Gospels.

**2. Movement 1: The Annunciation to Zechariah.**

- a. Elizabeth and Zechariah were old at this point and were unable to have a child. It's likely they longed and \_\_\_\_\_ for a child for decades.
- b. Their community likely saw their infertility as a lack of God's favor or even as a sign of \_\_\_\_\_.

***"Both of them were righteous before God, living blamelessly according to all the commandments and regulations of the Lord."*** Luke 1:6

- c. Zechariah's choice to offer incense that day was likely a once-in-a-lifetime experience and the exact moment the angel Gabriel showed up with a big \_\_\_\_\_.

**3. Movement 2: "Your Prayers Have Been Heard."**

***"...the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayers have been heard."*** Luke 1:13

- a. *“Your prayers have been heard”* implies they have prayed for a child for a long time.
- b. Prayer does not work as if God is a \_\_\_\_\_ in a bottle, ready to grant our wishes if we ask the right way.
  - i. Sometimes God does answer prayers with a \_\_\_\_\_.
  - ii. Most often God answers our prayers with God's very presence, promising to be with us and walk with us through \_\_\_\_\_ times.

4. Movement 3: God Chooses the Very Old.

*“But they were childless because Elizabeth was not able to conceive, and they were both very old.”*

Luke 1:7

- a. Despite their old age, or perhaps \_\_\_\_\_ of it, God chose Elizabeth and Zechariah as the ones to be parents to John the Baptist.
- b. The \_\_\_\_\_ of God choosing older people occurs frequently throughout scripture.
- c. Older adults are a tremendous \_\_\_\_\_ to the church and God calls them to serve.
- d. We never \_\_\_\_\_ from the work God calls us to and, in whatever stage of life we find ourselves, God is seeking to use us.

5. Movement 4: A People Prepared for the Lord.

*“...for he (John) will be great in the sight of the Lord...even before his birth he will be filled with the Holy Spirit. He will turn many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. With the spirit and power of Elijah he will go before him, to turn the hearts of parents to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous, to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.”* Luke 1:15-17

*“See, I will send you the prophet Elijah before the great and terrible day of the Lord comes. 6 He will turn the hearts of parents to their children and the hearts of children to their parents, so that I will not come and strike the land with a curse.”* Malachi 4:5-6

*A voice cries out: “In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God.”* Isaiah 40:3

- a. Preparing for the Lord: Turning our hearts and \_\_\_\_\_ back to God and turning toward one another in love and care.
